Greetings to all members:

The good news shall be mentioned first. I'll give the bad news when your are not paying attention.

I believe there will be an improvement in the operations of the Gravity Feed in the months to come. The new procedures involving printing hard copy for those who are not connected to the Internet has not had complete success. Part of the problem has been the difficulty in printing the newsletter directly from the Web site. Other problems are the download times for the online newsletters and PDF files. For best results, click on a PDF file and have breakfast. The file will be there when you finish your coffee.

These difficulties were magnified by some inefficient procedures I have been using in preparing the newsletters. I was also confronted with learning how to use PDF files. A major problem has been the use of high resolution digital images in the newsletter. High resolution is not required to make good prints the size of our newsletter or the size viewed on a monitor. My future digital images will have about one-tenth as much information, but the eye will not notice the difference.

The bad news is, I will ask members to give the online newsletters another chance. Suggestions and help will be offered to members to make the online experience enjoyable. Proper construction and use of PDF files makes it easy to view and print web pages.

PDF files can be transferred very efficiently (but slowly) by the Internet or by e-mail. They can be printed a page at a time or all at once, and the document will look exactly like the original. Or, one can choose to print in black and white.

More will be said about Gravity Feed procedures at future meetings.

People began arriving in a little while, and thankfully Jerry Williams was kind enough to bring the doughnuts to go with the coffee that Joel had made. (*There is nothing like writing about yourself in the third person*). The people in attendance to enjoy this wonderful day included Richard K. Barrett, Vern Van De Wall, Ed Barnhart, Dave Pulhamus, Larry Smith, Tony Caruso, Ron Ayers, Dayna Shaw, and as was mentioned, Jerry Williams.

After coffee, doughnuts, and much great conversation, we all followed Joel's newly re-manufactured Late 1931 Pickup truck out to the Macedon/Perinton border to the magnificent estate (my perception) of Howard Sharp. There were two Brittany Spaniels there to greet us, along with Howard and his wife. After we all parked, it was noted that there was an old Viele automobile there on that side of the house, along with various and sundry other vehicles too numerous to mention. The other side of the house had a 1916 Oldsmobile, along with a modified 1932 crosscountry racer. Interesting fact - the boat tail speedster rear end was fabricated from a 1938 Ford hood! Inside of the structures there were many gas pumps from the teens right up to more recent times. There were old snow mobiles, old outboard motors, and almost too much to remember. The garage has a nice very old small metal lathe next to a wood-burning stove, a very cozy setup for those cold winter months! Dayna was very interested in Howard's collection of hat pins, old purses, and hat pin holders.



There were old sleds, as well as a collection of 1950's Schwinn bicycles. The author can really relate to these!

Downhill a little bit was a shed with many old, old bicycles hanging from the ceiling. Some of these had wooden wheel rims, wooden chain guards, and many other primitive appointments, again almost too much for the eye to take in.

The next portion of the journey was to follow Howard and his wife in the 1932 Ford Cross-country Racer across the wilds of Macedon out into the country North of Route 31F. The REAL surprise was sitting inside of a huge metal garage/barn/commercial building down a way off of the road. This structure was filled with the most exotic vehicles from the very early 1900's up to an early 1960's police car. The site was MIND BOG-GLING!! A couple of

INTERESTING ANTEDOTE: The truck leading the procession would not go over 40 - or 45 miles per hour no matter how hard the gas pedal was pushed into the floor. The first stop revealed that the gas linkage was not able to work all of the way. There was only half throttle. Our President, Dick Barrett, analyzed the problem. We agreed that the linkage was not traveling far enough. The second stop revealed that the problem was that the gas pedal had a thick rubber cover on it, which was stopping the pedal (and subsequent linkage) from working properly. Vern and Ed noticed this while Joel and the others were inside. This change made a very notable change in performance!! Just ask Ed, who was riding with me!


